
METHODOLOGY:

KEY FINDINGS:


1. Syllabus covered in the class

How much of the syllabus was covered in the class? 519 responses




2. Teacher's preparation for the class

How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 519 responses




3. Teachers Communication skill

How well were the teachers able to communicate? 519 responses




4. Teachers approach to teaching

The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as $_{\rm 519\,responses}$




5. Fairness of Internal evaluation

6. Feedback on assignment


Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 519 responses

The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.



The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.



9. Information about expected competencies and outcomes


Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.


10. Mentor does necessary follow up

Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you. 519 responses




11. Illustrates concepts through examples

The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 519 responses




12. Teacher identifies strengths and encourages students

The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges. ⁵¹⁹ responses




13. Teachers identify weakness and helps students overcome

Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them. ⁵¹⁹ responses




14. Use of Student Centric methods by teachers/ institution

The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences. ⁵¹⁹ responses




15. Institution efforts to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills
