
METHODOLOGY:

A total of 373 students responded to the survey. Some students were randomly selected for one-on-one interviews to delve deeper into their experiences and perspectives.

KEY FINDINGS:

1. Relevance of topic learnt to employability:


- 45.5% respondents which is the majority stated that there is good relevance to the topics learnt concerning employability
- 28.7% respondents agreed that the relevance of the topics learnt to employability is very good
- 13.4% respondents agreed that the relevance of the topics learnt to employability is Excellent and 9.9% opined that it is average.

- Whereas 15.8% respondents said that it is Excellent


2. The knowledge learnt from the topics of study is 373 responses

- 9.9 % disagreed that they were motivated to self-learning


3. Students are motivated to indulge in self learning 373 responses

- Whereas 12.9% respondents mentioned that it is average


4. The dissemination of updated information regarding University Regulations and Syllabus is 373 responses


METHODOLOGY:

• Everyone agreed that they are highly satisfied with the communication level of the students




2. Developing practical solutions to workplace problems



Working as a part of a team



80% respondents stated that they were very happy with the creative ability of students to meet work place challenges where as 20% mentioned that they were satisfied


Creative in response to workplace challenges 5 responses

80% of employers said they were very happy with the planning and organization skills of our students where as 20% mentioned they were happy.


Their planning and organization skills 5 responses


Self-motivated and taking on appropriate level of responsibility 5 responses


Open to new ideas and learning new techniques 5 responses

80% of employers said they were very happy with the usage of technology and workplace equipment of our students where as 20% mentioned they were happy.


Using technology and workplace equipment 5 responses

Ability to contribute to the goal of the organization 5 responses








12. Innovation and Creativity



Relationship with seniors/peers/subordinates 5 responses







1. Relevance of course to the programme:


- 62.8% agreed that the courses taught were relevant to the programme

2. Knowledge acquired from the subject


- Majority respondents 68.7% agreed that the course has very well helped increase knowledge and understanding of the subject

- 3. The reference books prescribed were relevant and updated.





- 5. The college undertook adequate academic initiatives in order to bridge the gap between theory and its industrial application






METHODOLOGY:

- 1. The University curriculum is need based 86 responses




2. Relevance of syllabus to real life situations

2. The syllabus is relevant to real life situations






4. Course offered are relevant to the programme




5. Syllabus inculcates learning values



6. Technology Integration and new teaching methodologies:


- 63.5% respondents agreed that the curriculum facilitates the integration of new techniques and strategies for teaching
