#### 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The institution envisions imparting knowledge to learners to excel in their personal and professional lives. Adhering to the prescribed syllabus of the University, the institution explains to the students at the beginning of each semester the core competencies and learning outcomes that all students should achieve by the end of the program. It also offers flexibility in curriculum delivery through Elective Courses and Open Courses as prescribed by the University. The institution offers flexible and innovative curricula that include credit-based courses and projects in the areas of community engagement and service to the Postgraduate students of Social Work and Psychology, Environmental education to all its students through the Audit course and value-based education towards the attainment of holistic and multidisciplinary education through the Value education course offered by the Christian Chair of the University of Calicut. The Institution in its approach towards the integration of humanities and science with STEM, provides ICT-enabled courses to the students of Commerce through Certificate Programmes in MS EXCEL, Tally, Mathematics through Certificate Courses in Cyber Security, IOT and Tally, Malayalam through Malayalam Computing and so on. Also, the institution imparts training in Quantitative Techniques and Reasoning to all the students to help them acquire the fundamental knowledge of Mathematics.

#### 16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) is a novel and innovative approach to academic assessment and credit recognition, designed to facilitate a seamless and flexible learning experience. Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies has embraced the concept of the Academic Bank of Credit, positioning itself as a forward-thinking institution ready to adapt to the evolving demands of the educational landscape.

The Academic Bank of Credit operates as a repository that stores academic credits earned by students across various courses and disciplines. This system allows students to accumulate credits based

on the skills and knowledge they acquire, irrespective of the traditional semester-based structure. Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies recognizes the potential of this system in providing students with a more personalized and adaptable learning journey.

Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies, though has not yet implemented the Academic Bank of Credit, is well-equipped and prepared to do so when the need arises in tune with the adoption of the same by the University of Calicut. The institution acknowledges the importance of staying ahead of the curve in education, and the Academic Bank of Credit aligns with its commitment to fostering an environment of continuous learning and innovation.

The College's state-of-the-art infrastructure, experienced faculty, and commitment to educational excellence make it a suitable candidate for the introduction of the Academic Bank of Credit. The institution's proactive approach ensures that students will benefit from a system that recognizes and values their diverse skill sets, competencies, and experiences beyond traditional academic parameters.

Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies recognizes the transformative potential of the Academic Bank of Credit in promoting a more inclusive, student-centric, and competency-based education system. The institution's readiness to adopt this system demonstrates its commitment to preparing students for the dynamic challenges of the future, where adaptability and continuous learning are key to success.

#### 17.Skill development:

The institution to strengthen the soft skills of students in alignment with the National Skills Qualifications Framework has constituted a separate department called the Department of Human Excellence whose Trainers focus on imparting various skills to all the students of the institution namely, soft skills, life, professional and management skills. Since 2022 the institution is imparting the curriculum as given by University Grants Commission in Jeevan Kaushal 2.0. Students after completion of the soft skill course undergoes an examination conducted by Cambridge Assessment English and University Press on qualifying which gets a Cambridge Course completion certificate in soft skills. Apart from that all students are provided with value-added programmes in collaboration with national and international institutions of repute that help them in bridging the gap between industry and academia and foster their easy movement towards employability. Industry experts from

various streams are invited to deliver talks which provide the students with a needed understanding of the current scenario. Apart from that the institution is providing Value-based education to inculcate positivity amongst the learner including the development of humanistic, ethical, constitutional, and universal human values through the Value education programme offered by the Christian chair of the University of Calicut. Since 2019, it is made mandatory that each student completes at least two certificate programmes. All students undergo certificate course in Yoga and meditation apart from the Business English Certificate offered by the Cambridge Assessment English and University Press for Communication Skills.

### 18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

To integrate the Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture etc) into the curriculum the Institution provides Malayalam and Hindi as additional languages. Even though the medium of instruction is English for most Programmes offered, bilingual classroom delivery is encouraged so as to ease the subject understanding and to give due importance to vernacular language. Moreover, the institution has tried to preserve and promote Indian culture and tradition as part of its curriculum even within the framework as given by the affiliating University where ever possible, an example of which is the Modern Indian History course which is chosen as a complementary Course to the BA English programme. The institution through its Best Practice Sapthasadassuthe seven Arenas consisting of Dance, Music, Theatre, Painting, Still Modelling, Writing, and Digital Art provides a platform for students to identify their interests, talent, to showcase them and explore the various Indian art forms. The institution also provides opportunities for interested students to learn one or more of these within the three years of their study. Apart from that, the institution celebrates the local, regional and national festivals thereby helping students to understand the culture and tradition of the country.

#### 19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Attainment of Graduate Attributes by all learners is ensured by the institution by adhering to the Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes prescribed by the University. Attainment of the outcomes is assessed through various methods by departments namely Internal exams, seminars, assignments, projects, practicals, case study analysis, fieldwork, mini projects and so on. During the academic year, faculty members were provided with hands-on training on measuring the attainment of programme and course outcome through the

#### **20.Distance education/online education:**

The teaching-learning process in the institution is aided by the ICT facilities like Audio Visual Room, Interactive Touch Panels, LCD projectors and Wi-Fi which are helpful in imparting online courses too. The institution with its status of SWAYAM NPTEL Local Chapter holds the potential to expand the virtual mode of learning. The institution has a COURSERA PLUS account for conducting MOOC. Microsoft EduCloud campus agreement for using licensed products including Microsoft Teams, Sharepoint, Outlook and Office 365, adds to the technological infrastructure for teaching and learning suitable for the extension of online education to the learners. Also, the faculty members are encouraged to upload video lectures as well as study materials in the Learning Management system whereby the students can log in and access it at any point in time which will enable Self-paced Learning enabling blended learning.

#### Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The University's diverse curriculum focuses on cross-cutting issues, imparting knowledge through classroom sessions, extension activities, and institutional practices. The curriculum includes courses in areas such as Business Management, Principles of Software, and Counseling, Management theory, Sahitya vimarsanam and so on emphasizing the importance of professional ethics.

In terms of gender, the curriculum offers courses covering topics like Feminism and Social Commitment, corporate governance and business ethics, Gender studies, Rural & Urban Community, Entrepreneurship development, Voice of women, Social work and vulnerable groups, basic theory of psychology. Various activities, including those by the Women Development Cell, department seminars, webinars, talks, and workshops, aim to deepen understanding of gender justice, equity, and inclusivity.

The curriculum also encompasses courses fostering human values in courses like Human resources and Management, Appreciating fiction, Kadhasahithyam, Malayala sahityam, Human rights, Management Concepts and Business ethics and Social Psychology.

Topics in the environment, are covered in courses Environmental Chemistry to Non-Conventional Energy Sources, business ethics, Environmental geology, Drishyakalasahithyam, Appreciating poetry etc. Activities organized by NSS unit and Nature Club help students apply classroom knowledge to real-world environmental concerns.

Sustainability is addressed through courses like Advanced and Applied Chemistry, Corporate Governance, Environmental studies, Disaster management and Business Ethics. The institution ensures curriculum delivery with a focus on social commitment, shaping students into contented and refined individuals.

Recognizing the importance of fostering active student engagement for critical thinking and problem-solving skills, the college employs experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies.

Experiential learning, at the core of Sahrdaya's pedagogical philosophy, integrates hands-on experiences like internships, fieldwork, experiments, and industry collaborations. This approach reinforces academic concepts, instills curiosity, and cultivates problem-solving skills, bridging the gap between theory and practice.

Participative learning emphasizes collaborative methods through group discussions, seminars, interactive sessions, and events, fostering a sense of community, enhancing communication, and teamwork skills. Some of the examples of such events are the Exhibition Cum Sale of Hygiene products by the Dept of Chemistry, Hyde Park the public speaking platform by the PG Department of English, Community engagement activities by NSS and so on.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The institution operates on well-established systems and procedures for the management and utilization of its physical, academic, and support facilities. Each department takes responsibility for the maintenance of facilities like laboratories, sports complexes, computer rooms, and classrooms. The dedicated in-house staff ensures daily upkeep and periodic checks, following Standard Operating Procedures in case of breakdowns.

Laboratories are managed by appointed faculty members and assistants who maintain and upgrade equipment regularly. The library, automated with Linways, undergoes systematic stock verification and proactive interventions to ensure optimal availability of instructional materials. Sports facilities are monitored by the Head of Physical Education, with preventive maintenance measures in place, while class rooms are allocated and cleaned daily, overseen by an infrastructure supervisor.

IT facilities receive annual maintenance, with upgraded software and Smart Class Rooms under Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMC). Electrical and drinking water facilities are maintained by employed electricians and plumbers. Security, including CCTV surveillance, is managed by a dedicated team, and seminar halls and AV rooms are well-equipped and regularly maintained.

Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies places a paramount emphasis on continuous enhancement in its teaching-learning process, operational methodologies, and learning outcomes. The institution diligently conducts periodic reviews through its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), adhering to established norms.

The previous accreditation report had mentioned the need for starting action research projects in villages of the adjoining districts to act as an agent of change and that the institution should have mechanism for collecting feedback from stake holders and that the follow- up action taken needs to be closely monitored by IQAC.

Accordingly in the assessment year 2022-23, IQAC had initiated the college to register for Unnath Bharath Abhiyan a flagship programme of the Ministry of Education, Govt of India through which we plan to adopt 5 villages in and around our institution thereby participating actively in community thereby initiating developmental projects beneficial that will help us act as change agent.

During the year 2022-23, we had also collected feedback from various stakeholders like Students, Faculty, Alumni and Employer. And as per the recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team, the feedback were analysed and necessary action were initiated. The institution's Women Development Cell (WDC) proactively conducts workshops, seminars, and webinars on gender equality and sensitization, featuring qualified resource persons. Additionally, students receive classes addressing gender equity and fostering healthy relationships with the opposite gender. The WDC extends its impact beyond campus through outreach activities aimed at empowering women in the larger society.

Ensuring the safety of female students is a top priority, with surveillance cameras installed on campus and dedicated security officers offering supervision and assistance. To regulate student departures, individuals leaving before closing hours must obtain permission from the Principal, who issues gate passes, and security guards ensure compliance.

Class attendance is meticulously tracked through the Learning Management System, Linways, with absences promptly communicated to parents. The institution prioritizes health, providing separate sick

rooms for boys and girls, staffed by a qualified nurse. Hygienic conditions are maintained through well-equipped restrooms, including a girls' restroom with a sanitary napkin vending machine.

The institution provides self-defense classes, counseling services, a mentor-mentee Gurukula system, and a hygienic canteen for student well-being. Common/retiring rooms are also available for ladies. These measures reflect the institution's commitment to holistic student development.

The institution effectively manages its waste by segregating and disposing of bio-degradable, non-biodegradable, and electronic waste. Here are the measures in place:

1. Biogas Plant: Waste from the college canteen is directed to a 10 cubic meter fixed dome biogas plant. The bio-slurry produced serves

as plant manure while the generated biogas replaces approximately 140 kg of LPG monthly, offering a renewable energy source. Additionally, the bio waste acts as a natural insecticide, eliminating the need for toxic pesticides.

- 2. Incinerator: Waste like paper and sanitary napkins undergo incineration. The ash residue, combined with cow dung, is repurposed as plant fertilizer.
- 3. Sewage Treatment Plant: A sewage treatment facility is in place to process wastewater from toilets and laboratories. Treated water irrigates campus greenery.
- 4. Electronic Waste: A third-party periodically collects electronic waste under an MoU.
- 5. Laboratory Wastes: Hazardous chemicals and old substances are collected in a dedicated concrete tank to prevent contamination. The tank safely manages hazardous waste without harming the environment.

Additionally, daily cleaning and sanitization of toilets are conducted by staff, with waste bins strategically placed across the institution for efficient waste collection and disposal.
