



'FYUGP'

The Four-year undergraduate programme curriculum is a structural and methodological departure from the existing curriculum. The existing three-year programme shall remain within the four-year programme with options of lateral entry and single exit. Outcome Based Education (OBE) practices are to be used to design the curriculum. The regulations of the four-year UG programme aim at synthesizing degrees, which is now an international standard adopted by all the universities across the world. While synthesizing degrees, there shall be no restriction on the subjects/ courses across the disciplines, as far as possible. Conscious efforts to develop cognitive and non-cognitive problem-solving skills among the learners shall be part of the curriculum. The programmes shall empower graduates as expert problem-solvers using their disciplinary knowledge and collaborating in multi-disciplinary teams.

FEATURES AND OBJECTIVES OF CUFYUGP

The features and objectives of the Calicut University Four-Year Under Graduate Programmes (CUFYUGP) shall be as follows:

- 1 The features, meaning, and purpose of CUFYUGP shall be as stipulated by the UGC and as adapted by the Kerala State Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (KSUCF)
- 2 The practice of lateral entry of students to various years exists, but an exit with a Degree shall be awarded only upon successful completion of the third year.
- 3 CUFYUGP shall have three Broad Pathways, (a) 3-year UG Degree, (b) 4-year UG Degree (Honours), and (c) 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research).
- 4 Students who choose to exit after 3 years shall be awarded UG Degree in their respective Major Discipline after the successful completion of the required minimum of courses of total 133 credits.
- 5 A four-year UG Degree (Honours) in the Major Discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the CUFYUGP with

- a specific number of courses of total 177 credits, including 8 credits from an optional graduate project/dissertation in their Major/allied discipline.
- 6 Honours students who have not undertaken their graduate project shall do two additional courses in the Major discipline, each comprising four credits.
- The Students who aspire to pursue research as a career may opt for Honours with Research stream in the fourth year. A four-year UG Degree (Honours with Research) in the Major Discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the CUFYUGP with a specific number of courses of total 177 credits, including 12 credits from a mandatory graduate research project/dissertation in their Major discipline.
- 8 The approved research centres of this University or any other university / higher educational institution (HEI) can offer the Honours with Research programme.
- 9 The departments in the affiliated colleges under the University, which are not the approved research centres of the University, should get prior approval from the University to offer the Honours with Research programme. Such departments should have minimum one faculty member with Ph.D., and they should also have the necessary infrastructure to offer Honours with Research programme.
- 10 Students who secure 75% marks and above (equivalently, CGPA 7.5 and above) cumulatively in the first six semesters are eligible to get selected to Honours with Research stream in the fourth year.
- 11 A faculty member of the University/College with a Ph.D. degree can supervise the research project of the students who have opted for Honours with Research. One such faculty member can supervise maximum four students in Honours with Research stream
- 12 The students who have opted for the Honours with Research should successfully complete a research project under the guidance of the mentor and should submit a research report for evaluation. They need to defend successfully the research

- project to obtain 12 credits. The research shall be in the Major/allied discipline.
- 13 The proposed FYUGP curriculum shall comprise Three Broad Parts: a) Foundation Components, b) Discipline Specific Pathway components (Major/ Minor), and c) Discipline Specific Capstone Components.
- 14 The Foundation component of the FYUGP shall consist of a Set of General Foundation Courses and a Set of Discipline Specific Foundation Courses.
- 15 General Foundation Courses shall be common for all students and shall be grouped into 4 major baskets as Ability Enhancement courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Added Courses (VAC), and Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC).
- 16 Discipline Specific Foundation Courses are the Major and Minor courses in the first two semesters. They shall focus on foundational theories, concepts, perspectives, principles, methods, skills, and critical thinking essential for taking up advanced Courses.
- 17 Ability Enhancement Courses shall be designed specifically to achieve competency in English and Additional Languages as per the student's choice with special emphasis on language and communication skills.
- 18 The courses on Additional Languages shall be designed to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and academic writing skills, expository as well as the cultural and intellectual heritage of the language chosen.
- 19 Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC) shall be so designed as to enable the students to broaden their intellectual experience by understanding the conceptual foundations of Science, Social sciences, Commerce, Language, Humanities, and Liberal Arts. All the UG students are required to undergo two introductory-level MDC in any of the disciplines other than their chosen Major discipline, and a third MDC in Kerala-knowledge System, to be offered by English and Additional Language disciplines.

- 20 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) shall be designed to enhance workplace skills such as Creativity, Critical Thinking, Communication, and Collaboration—21st-century Skills.
- 21 Value Added Courses (VAC) shall be so designed as to empower the students with personality development, perspective building, and self-awareness.
- 22 Discipline Specific Pathway Components (Major/ Minor) shall provide the students with an opportunity to pursue in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline and develop competency in that chosen area, which includes Major courses, Minor courses and discipline specific elective Courses.
- 23 Major Components shall be the main focus of study. By selecting a Major, the student shall be provided with an opportunity to pursue an in-depth study of a particular discipline.
- 24 The students in a Major discipline can choose as their Minor stream the Minor courses offered by the same discipline or a different discipline. In the former case the content of the Minor stream can be related to the Major discipline, but the Minor stream should maintain a distinct academic identity. Students shall have the option to choose courses from disciplinary/interdisciplinary Minors and skill-based courses related to a chosen vocational education programme.
- 25 Students shall be permitted to switch their Major at the end of the second semester by giving them sufficient time to explore different courses during the first year.
- 26 The student has the option to register for and attend a course without taking part in the continuous assessment and end-semester examination of that course. Such a course is called the Audit Course. If the student has 75% attendance in an Audit Course, he/she is eligible for a pass in that course, without any credit (zero-credit). The Audit Course will be recorded in the final grade card of the student. This option can be used by the student to gain interdisciplinary knowledge.
- 27 Major components consist of three types: Discipline Specific Core Courses, Discipline Specific Elective Courses, and Research/laboratory/fieldwork.

- 28 The Capstone-Level Courses shall be designed in such a manner so as to enable students to demonstrate their cumulative knowledge in their main field of study, which shall include advanced thematic specialization or internships, community engagement or services, vocational or professional training, or other kinds of work experience
- 29 Advanced Major Specialization shall include courses focused on a specific area of study attached to a specific Major, which could be an Elective Course. They shall include research methodology as well.
- 30 All students shall undergo Internship or Apprenticeship in a firm, industry or organization, or training in labs with faculty and researchers of their own institution or other Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) or research institutions.
- 31 Students shall be provided with opportunities for internships with local industries, business organizations, agriculture, health and allied sectors, Local Government institutions (such as panchayats, municipalities), State Planning Board, State Councils/Boards, elected representatives to the parliament/ state assembly/panchayath, media organizations, artists, crafts persons etc. These opportunities will enable the students to actively engage in the practical aspects of their learning and to improve their employability.
- 32 Social Activities shall include participation in National Service Scheme (NSS), sports and games, arts, participation in university/college union related activities (for respective elected /nominated members), National Cadet Corps (NCC), adult education/literacy initiatives, mentoring school students, and engaging in similar social service organizations that deemed appropriate to the University.
- Options shall be made available for students to earn credit by completing qualityassured remote learning modes, including online programmes offered on the Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM) or other online educational platforms approved by the Board of Study from time to time.

- 34 Students shall be entitled to earn maximum 16 credits through such online courses in their eighth semester to complete the minimum credits required for the award of the fouryear Honours Degree.
- 35 The University shall advise the students to opt for such Online/MOOC/Signature Courses that have a comprehensive graded evaluation with proper grades and grade points.

The assessment shall be a combination of continuous comprehensive assessment and an end-semester evaluation.

Continuous comprehensive assessment will have two subcomponents: Formative assessment and Summative Assessment. The course-faculty can choose any combination of assessment methods listed below in both categories.

Formative Assessment: Formative assessment refers to a wide variety of methods that teachers use to conduct in-process evaluations of student comprehension, learning needs, and academic progress during a lesson, unit, or course. Suggestive methods of formative assessment are as follows: (i) Practical Assignment, (ii) Observation of practical skills, (iii) Viva voce, (iv) Quiz, (v) Interview, (vi) Oral presentations, (vii) Computerized adaptive testing, (viii) In-class discussions, (ix) Instructor-created exams, (x) Seminar presentations, (xi) Clicker question, (xii) Low-stakes group work, (xiii) Group Tutorial work, (xiv) One-minute reflection writing assignments, (xv) Home assignments, (xvi) Self and peer Assessments, (xvii) Any other method as may be required for specific course/student as implemented by the instructor.

Summative Assessment: Summative assessments are used to evaluate student learning, skill acquisition, and academic achievement at the conclusion of a defined instructional period—typically at the end of a project, unit, course or semester. The method of evaluation/assessment may be as follows: (i) Written test, (ii) Open book test, (iii) Laboratory report, (iv) Problem based assignments, (v) Individual project report, (vi) Case study report, (vii) Team project report, (viii) Literature survey, (ix) Standardized Test, (x) Any other pedagogic approach specifically designed for a particular course by the instructor.

30% weightage shall be given for continuous comprehensive assessment. The remaining 70% weight shall be for the end-semester evaluation.

LETTER GRADES AND GRADE POINTS

Mark system is followed for evaluating each question.

For each course in the semester letter grade and grade point are introduced in 10- point indirect grading system as per guidelines given below

The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed from the grades as a measure of the student's performance in a given semester. The Cumulative GPA (CGPA) is based on the grades in all courses taken after joining the programme of study.

Only the weighted grade point based on marks obtained shall be displayed on the grade card issued to the students.

When students take audit courses, they may be given pass (P) or fail (F) grade without any credits.

The successful completion of all the courses and capstone components prescribed for the three-year or four-year programme with 'P' grade shall be the minimum requirement for the award of UG Degree or UG Degree (Honours) or UG Degree (Honours with Research), as the case may be.

Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies, in her 10th year of inception, made a milestone by collaborating with Cambridge Assessment English, Cambridge University and has signed the MoU on 7th December 2021. Sahrdaya provides various Cambridge English qualifications ranging from B1 to C1 level. Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies, under IDET has turned to be the second authorized Cambridge Exam Centre in our state. Our college aims to provide a sophisticated learning experience to nurture the proficiency and knowledge relevant in the presently competent corporate globe, in terms of higher education, employment, and other opportunities available worldwide. With qualified and trained faculty members, all resources and task based contents as per the regulations of Cambridge Assessment English, Sahrdaya offers all students the opportunity to enroll and build themselves as confident English language speakers. Currently, our college has conducted exams for more than 1500 students since 2019 and has extended this privilege to other educational institutions as well.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

(N.S.S.)

National Service Scheme aims at developing student's personality through community service. NSS volunteers work to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity. The main objectives are:

- · Helping the students to develop a democratic attitude and leadership qualities.
- Assisting the students to share responsibilities and develop abilities.
- · Supporting the students to make use of their skills and knowledge to find practical solutions to community and individual problems.

Membership: Students can join the NSS scheme by registering themselves via the concerned Programme Officer at the beginning of each academic year. Each student is subject to its discipline and code of behavior. NSS is 2 years activity-based programme, in that social service of 120 hours (first year) + 120 hours (second year) + 1 NSS residential camp is mandatory to complete this programme. After 2 years of NSS, volunteers will get a certificate from the university.

At Sahrdaya College, we have an NSS Unit, which started on 18th December 2020. The strength of the NSS Unit is around 50 students each year. The major activities include Adventure Programmes, Plantation, Blood donation, Community surveys, Awareness Rallies, Cleaning etc.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a pool of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the Nation regardless of

which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join the armed forces. To train volunteer youth to become confident, committed and competent leaders in all walks of life.

- (e) Provide a platform to launch good-will ambassadors cadets to project the image of the country overseas.

Sahrdaya College Of Advanced Studies, Kodakara has been sanctioned SD/SW 108 cadets vide approval given by the group commander, NCC Group Head Quarters, Ernakulam under the fully selffinancing scheme out of turn allotment in December 2020.

COMMUNICATIVE SKILLS (C SKILLS)

COMPETITIVE EXAM TRAINING (CET)

CET team guides students to meet the varying and challenging needs of examinations with specific goals of improving one's capability, capacity, productivity and performance and help sunderstand the concepts to develop necessary skills.

Logical Reasoning, Quantitative Aptitude, Analytical and Critical Thinking, General Knowledge, Coaching for exams of IBPS, PSC, Staff Selection Commission, and Railway Recruitment board etc.

PLACEMENT TRAINING (P Skills)

Placement training Programmes inculcates specific skills in students, to meet corporate expectations and making them

employable. The PLTR team coaches students by providing specific target oriented classroom sessions and lectures with hands-on experiencein group discussions, Mock Interviews, Debates and other extempore activities, thus instilling confidence and help gain corporate exposure.

Industry oriented Employability skills, Digital Resume, Job portals, Interview Skills, Entrepreneurship Skills, Interpersonal skills, Team management, SOP, Internship updates and Placement assistance.

WELLNESS BEATS (Counselling and Personal Interaction)

"Health is a state of complete Harmony of the body, mind and spirit". To ensure this, our Counsellors strive to provide a safe, non-judgmental, warm and caring environment giving students an opportunity for self-exploration and self-discovery. The Counselling team encourages students to embark on a journey towards personal growth with improved self-awareness and conflict resolution abilities by managing stress effectively in a vibrant, cheerful and positive way.

STUDY GROUPS AND MORNING ASSEMBLY:

The sessions are lead by the student study groups. Each study group submits a detailed report of their programme on the previous day, at the office duly signed by the Class-in-charge, for the approval of the Executive Director. The Programme includes Prayer, Thought for the Day, Daily News Headlines, Message from the Executive Director / Principal and College Anthem.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Absolute discipline is the mission of Sahrdaya College and to fulfil this, the following general rules are insisted on students.

- 1. Attitude of respect and love should be reflected in the behaviour towards elders, teachers, peers & everyone.
- Ragging in any form is a criminal offense and is strictly banned in the campus. Students can make use of guidance, counselling & student representative's meeting with Executive Director, Principal, Vice Principal, HODs, Animators & Teachers Redressal Cell, in case of complaints. Discipline should be maintained in the college campus even during college functions, events & activities.
- 3. College working time is from 9.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. and starts with a morning assembly which is mandatory for all students. Students should be punctual and are obliged to obey the rules and regulations of the College.
- 4. All the students are expected to reach campus by 8.45 am and be in the class/ assembly hall by 8.50 am when the first bell goes
- 5. Students who come late by more than 10 minutes will lose half day's attendance.
- 6. Possession or usage of mobilephone, any removable data storage device or hardware attachments for software operations are strictly prohibited on campus.
- 7. No guests /visitors shall be allowed with the students in the class /or on campus on working days.
- 8. Disruption of or improper interference with the academic, administrative, sporting, social or other activities of the Institution shall be punished.
- 9. Using abusive language and creating nuisance in the premises of the institution, disturbing the peace and independent rights of the fellow students and faculty members shall be deemed as an act of indiscipline.
- 10. During working hours, students are not allowed to move around

- in the campus. After the commencement of the class, students are not allowed to enter or go out of the classroom without the prior permission of the Principal.
- 11. Sahrdaya insists on dress code and ID card in campus for all students. The uniform should be purchased from the college and students should wear the uniform on all days. The students should also follow the dress code while going out for official programmes representing the college like study tour, participating in competitions, social service / placement test etc
- 12. The campus language is English. Speaking in other languages is restricted.
- 13. Cleanliness in classroom is essential. The students are advised to take utmost care while handling college articles. Avoid writing and posting notices on desks, benches and walls. Any damage to the property should be compensated by the students. The students are prohibited from displacing articles / furniture from their proper places in the classroom or laboratory. At the end of every semester the classroom furniture, articles and fixtures will be inspected and damages if any, must be compensated by the students / entire class.
- 14. Candidates will be permitted to appear for the University examinations only if he/she secures not less than 75% attendance in each semester. Students are expected to apply for leave through Linways. They should get approval from the class animator and HoD before taking leave. The prescribed leave application filled & duly signed by the parent/guardian should be submitted to the Principal. The Students should clear all the dues in every semester before submitting the application for the university examinations and for getting the hall ticket.
- 15. Politics is not allowed in the campus. The students are prohibited from organizing or attending meetings in the college, distributing notices and collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.

- 16. Anti-social activities like consumption of alcohol, drugs, smoking, manhandling (including unnecessary dragging or pushing one another) will be strictly dealt with.
- 17. Students using two or four wheelers for commuting to college should submit an application in the prescribed form with all details. The speed limit inside the campus is 20km/hr and students using vehicles should reach the campus before 8.50 a.m. Students are not permitted to leave their vehicles in the college porch under any circumstances and they are not allowed to drive 2 or 4 wheeler inside the campus beyond the permitted parking areas.
- 18. Parents/Guardians are allowed to meet the students only with prior permission and they are supposed to wait in the front office lobby.
- 19. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the college is entitled to take any punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct.
- 20. Immorality, Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual inattention to class work, contempt for authority, wil ful damage to college property, obscenity in word or deed, malpractice in examinations etc; are sufficient reasons for perma nent or temporary dismissal of a student.
- 21. Latecomers should not enter the classroom, without the permission of the teacher in charge of the class. In any case, latecomers will not be given attendance.
- 22. Parents or guardians are expected to respond to the calls from the college authorities, from time to time.
- 23. The members of the College students' council are chosen among the class representatives (one boy and one girl) who are directly elected from each class.
- 24. A call to the auditorium or conference hall for any programme must be promptly and strictly responded to. No one should remain in the classrooms or elsewhere during such occasions.

- 25. Discipline and decorum is expected from the students during programmes convened in the auditorium or elsewhere.
- 26. It is the responsibility of the student to earn a conduct certificate. It is not issued as a matter of right. Conduct certificate is issued on the basis of an overall evaluation by the teachers concerned.
- 27. Students who are charged with the criminal offence and are under suspension shall not be allowed to enter the campus and hostel without permission.
- 28. Students from the other institutions and outsiders shall not meet or interact with the students of the College inside the campus and hostel without the prior written consent of the Principal.
- 29. There shall not be any discrimination against any community or category of students of the College and immediate stringent action will be taken against the erring students.
- 30. Photography /video/ audio recording/ playing on the campus and in the college bus is strictly prohibited. Media coverage of programmes held in the college shall be done only by authorised personnel.
- 31. Students are not allowed to bring 4 wheelers and 2 wheeler vehicles above 350cc into the campus. They have to take vehicle pass to park their 2 wheelers at the allotted place at their own risk. Stunting and racing of vehicles with in and in a radius of 200 metres outside the campus are strictly banned.
- 32. Complaints of students will only be looked into if they are presented through the proper channel. Collective petitions however will not be allowed.
- 33. During the absence of the teacher as well as while moving from one class to another, care should be taken to observe silence.
- 34. Observance of strict silence during morning assembly is compulsory. Morning assembly is mandatory for students.
- 35. Hostel rules Hostel authorities may frame and issue from time to time disciplinary rules of permanent or temporary character

- regulating the conduct of students within and outside the College and the hostel premises with a view to maintain the discipline, credit and reputation of the College and the hostel.
- 36. College Students' council election will be conducted according to the Lyngdoh committee report dated 26 May 2006.
- 37. Students are not expected to use any methods to defame the institution in any manner, especially through social media. If such activities are noticed, strict actions shall be taken against such students, including filing of a complaint in the cybercell.
- 38. Semester certificate of attendance and progress required for admission to university examination as well as promotion shall not be given unless the applicant has attended at least 75% of the working days of the semester. Absence of 10 consecutive working days without information will result in the removal of the name from the rolls.
- 39. The College authorities reserve the rights to amend, repeal or modify any of the above rules. It is the responsibility of the students to get informed of all the rules and notifications of the college from time to time. Ignorance of these rules is not condoned

MISCONDUCT SHALL INCLUDE:

- Staying away from classes without sufficient reason.
- Disrespectful behaviour towards the staff and fellow students.
- Loitering in the verandas during free hours and creating disturbance to the classes in progress. (During free hours the students are expected to make use of Biblioteca)
- Disorderly behaviour in the class.
- Blocking gates/doors or passages which would restrict the mobility of staff and students in the college.
- Involvement in manhandling or harassing fellow students.
- Creating disturbances during functions/programmes by shouting, howling or dancing.

- Resorting to any kind of malpractice in the examinations.
- Collecting money from staff or students without the permission of the Principal.
- Distributing leaflets, hand-bills or other materials and displaying banners and posters inside the campus.
- Vandalism and destruction of College property will be severely dealt with and material loss will be fully recovered from the concerned.

ATTENDANCE AND PROMOTION

- 1. A student who absents himself from class without seeking leave during any one period of the day shall lose the full attendance of the session.
- 2. Students coming late to class will lose half a day's attendance. The teacher at his/her discretion may admit students who come late. He may also mark them present on a reasonable excuse.
- 3. Attendance will be strictly monitored and no one will be allowed to appear for University examinations if his attendance shortage is beyond 25%. Attendance will not be given for Union activities even if one is holding an elected office.
- 4. The number of absentees shall be put on the notice-board from time to time and any complaints regarding the same should be brought to the notice of the attendance clerk within 3 days.
- 5. Students have to satisfy attendance requirements for admission to end semester examinations
- 6. The annual attendance and progress certificate shall not be granted unless the student has attendance for three fourth numbers of working days prescribed by the University / college and the conduct of the student has been satisfactory.
- 7. A Student in a junior class who has earned required attendance/progress certificate will be eligible for promotion

- to the next higher class only if he has registered for examination at the end of the semester.
- 8. A student who has failed to earn the progress certificate for the academic semester at the end of which there is a semester examination must attend college to receive such additional instruction as the Principal may prescribe so as to enable the Principal to issue the progress certificate.
- 9. No attendance for instruction other than in an institution affiliated to the University shall qualify for admission to any examination of the college.

CERTIFICATES

- 1. Every student should take his Transfer Certificate at the end of his programme and produce it when he is admitted for the next programme.
- 2. No student who has previously studied in any recognised school or college (including Sahrdaya College of Advanced Studies, Kodakara) shall be admitted to the college unless he presents the transfer certificate.
- 3. No transfer certificate will be issued to those who have dues left.
- 4. No fee will be levied from those who apply for T.C within one year after leaving the college.
- 5. A fee of Rs.50/- will be levied from those who apply for T.C after the lapse of one year from the date of leaving the college.
- 6. A fine of Rs.100/- will be levied from those who apply for duplicate copy of the T.C.
- 7. A duplicate transfer certificate may be issued to a candidate only when the original is irrecoverably lost and on producing a written declaration made by the candidate in the prescribed form together with a certificate from a Judicial Magistrate in support of the declaration.

FORM OF DECLARATION FOR DUPLICATE T.C;

"I do hereby solemnly declare that the transfer certificate already issued to me was not utilized by me for appointment to any post or for admission to any programme of studies. The transfer certificate has been lost irrecoverably. In case I could trace the T.C after the issue of a duplicate, I shall surrender the same to the authorities forthwith".

- 8. A duplicate identity card will not be normally issued. However on recommendation of the principal, a duplicate card will be issued at a cost of Rs.100/-. On any account there will be no issue of more than two cards.
- 9. The college will own no responsibility for certificate if any, retained after six months of the completion of one's course or discontinuance from studies.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1 It is obligatory for all students to become members of the College Library.
- 2 Library hours are from 8.30 am to 4.30 pm
- 3 The Library shall remain closed on Sundays, Second Saturdays & other Public Holidays.
- 4 Readers shall keep silence within the Library premises.
- 5 It is mandatory to enter one's name and signature in the register kept at the entrance for using the Library.
- 6 Personal belongings such as umbrellas, bags, tiffin carriers etc. are to be kept in the racks provided at the entrance of the Library. Sleeping and indecorous behavior are prohibited inside the Library.
- 7 Readers should not mark, underline, write or tear pages or otherwise damage the library documents including books/magazines/journals etc.

- 8 No book which has been prescribed as a textbook for a class shall be lent to the students during the period for which it is prescribed as a textbook.
- 9. Books from Reference Section shall not be taken outside the Library. The use & issue of other books from the Library shall be governed by the following rules:
- 10 The student should ensure, before leaving the issue counter, as to whether the book is in good condition or not. The borrower will be held responsible for any defect/damage found at the time of return of the document, if not recorded earlier, and will be liable to pay the penalty as decided by the competent authority/Librarian.
- 11 Undergraduate students are allowed to take four books & Post graduate students may take six books at a time. Teaching staff are allowed to take ten books at a time while non-teaching staff can borrow five.
- 12 Books may be kept for 14 days by the users including students, teaching & non teaching staffs, but this period can be shortened in particular cases. They can be renewed for a further period of 14 days if no one else has applied for the same books. The renewal should be done by the users themselves during 12th, 13th or 14th day of issue of books.
- 13 The book(s) shall be returned on or before due date otherwise late fee/fine will be charged from all the borrowers @ Rs. 1 per day per book (including holidays). The book will be detained and the membership will be suspended till the payment of fine. Absence from the college will not be accepted as an excuse for not returning the books in time.
- 14 Sub lending & transfer of books to someone else is not permitted.
- 15 If a book is damaged, lost or spoiled, the member will have either to pay three times the price of the latest edition of the

- book or replace with a new copy. If the lost book is not available for replacement, value of the lost book will be realized at rates regulated by the Government.
- 16 All books must be returned three days before the end of each term. In case of students appearing for semester examination, they should return the books three days before the last working day. All the books borrowed from the Library by the students as well as members of teaching & non teaching staff must be returned within the first week of March every year.
- 17 Issue of Transfer Certificate & refund of caution deposit are done only after clearing all Library dues.

- 1. Students are requested to keep the all receipts of the payments made at the office till they receive all the certificates of the course they are pursuing.
- 2. A fine will be charged for delay in payment.
- 3. Students are advised to plan their bank remittances in advance before the banking day. The chalan can be obtained from the College Office during working days. Mention the purpose of remittance, amount, and get it counter signed and sealed (college seal) by the office staff.
- 4. It is compulsory to remit the Semester fees at the beginning of each semester.

The day begins with the morning Prayer session. All the staff and the students line up at the auditorium at 8:55 am. Late coming will be considered as serious disobedience.

DRESS CODE

- 1. Students are instructed to wear the official uniform of the college on all working days.
- 2. The supply of the material and the tailoring will be taken care of by the college. The charges pertaining to this are to be paid at the college store.
- 3. The students should also follow the dress code on occasions when they are representing the college participating in intercollegiate competitions, social service etc.

Boys:

- Shirt should be properly tucked inside the trousers.
- They are expected to have a formal haircut at all times.

Girls:

- ♦ They should have their hair neatly done. A neatly tied pony tail for short hair and well plaited hair for long hair is advisable.
- 4. Girls and boys are not allowed to wear precious ornaments.
- 5. Students are permitted to use colour dress with ID card on the following occasions:
 - ♦ Onam Celebrations
 - Christmas Celebrations
 - ♦ Farewell Day (Final years only)

The colour dress permitted in the campus are as follows:

Boys: Executive Pants & Shirts tucked in properly; with shoes.

(Dhoti, T. Shirts, Paniyans, Jeans etc. are not allowed)

 $(Dhoti, T-Shirts, Baniyans, Jeans \, etc. \, are \, not \, allowed).$

Girls: Churidar with duppatta. No other form of attire is permitted in the campus.

6. Any student who is found in non-uniform will be penalized.

IDENTITY CARD

- Students will be issued an Identity Card. They are expected to wear it while inside the campus, during inter-collegiate competitions, study tours, social service etc. and should furnish it for all official transactions in the college.
- 2. The Identity Card has to be surrendered at the office after the completion of the course or at the time of issuance of TC, whichever is earlier.
- 3. A student will be issued a Duplicate Identity Card only if he produces a declaration stating that the original identity card is irrecoverably lost; the declaration must be countersigned by his/her parent/guardian and the issue will be on payment of the administrative charges.

USE OF TWO-WHEELERS

- 1. Students who wish to commute to college on two-wheelers are required to submit an application to the Principal in the prescribed form along with stamp size photo, copy of their license, insurance and vehicle registration.
- 2. Students using two-wheelers are required to reach college before 8:45am.
- 3. They are not allowed to leave their vehicles in the College Portico at any cause. The vehicles have to be parked in the parking lot only.
- 4. They are not permitted to drive the vehicles beyond the permitted limits.
- 5. The speed limit inside the campus is 20 Km/ph.
- 6. As per the university norms four wheelers are not allowed inside the campus

COLLEGE BUS

- Regular transportation facilities are provided to major locations.
- 2. Students can get details of the time of arrival of the buses at various locations from the Front Office/Admin. Office.
- 3. The buses shall depart from the College at 4:10 pm every day.
- 4. Students who would like to avail the transport facility have to remit the prescribed fee and obtain the bus pass.
- 5. No student will be allowed to travel in the college bus without the valid bus pass.
- 6. The bus pass has to be produced to the college authorities whenever asked for.
- 7. Students are expected to maintain discipline while travelling by the college bus.
- 8. The students should board and alight at the same place mentioned in the bus pass.
- 9. The seat arrangement is as follows: girls at the front, boys at the back and the middle portion is reserved for the teachers

REPROGRAPHY-KIOSK

- 1. Photocopying from any reference book has to be recommended by the faculty concerned.
- 2. Photocopying is not permited during class hours.
- 3. The services will be provided only at the break times.

CAFETERIA

- 1. The dining area provided for students should be kept neat.
- 2. Do not spill or waste food.
- 3. Maintain discipline in and around the area.

INTERNAL/MODEL EXAMINATION

- 1. Internal / model examinations in all courses will be conducted as directed by the University.
- 2. The date and time of the internal / model examinations will be informed to the students well in advance.
- 3. All the students have to appear for the internal / model examinations and no leave will be granted for those days.
- 4. Students who fail to appear for the internal / model examinations without prior permission are required to bring their parent / guardian on the very next day and appropriate action will be taken.
- 5. Whatever be the reason for absence, re-test/test improvement will not be conducted for those who have not appeared for the internal / model examinations.
- 6. The marks secured by the students will be informed to their parents .
- 7. Any kind of malpractice in the exam hall will be seriously dealt with. Students resorting to such deeds will be asked to leave the hall immediately and the matter will be reported to the Principal.

ASSIGNMENT/SEMINAR

- 1. As required by the University, students will be required to submit assignments or seminars in all courses of the programme.
- 2. Topics for assignments/seminar will be given to the student well in advance.
- 3. The assignment should be submitted on or before the date of submission. Non-submission or delayed submission will be seriously dealt with.

- 4. Students can refer to text books, reference books etc. for writing the assignment and preparing the seminar report.
- 5. Assignments/ Seminar report should be submitted in the prescribed format by the student within the stipulated.
- 6. Students are not allowed to share their assignments with their classmates.
- 7. The grades once granted will be final and no improvement is allowed in case of substandard assignments.
- 8. The presentation should be done on the assigned date.
- 9. Seminar report should be submitted by the student in the prescribed format only.
- 10. The grades once granted will be final and no improvement is allowed in case of substandard assignments and seminar presentation.

EDUCATIONAL TOUR

All students are expected to undertake an educational tour during the course in the Third and Fifth Semester.

Third Semester Tour: All the students are advised to visit an industry / institute in their area of specialization.

I. Guidelines for educational tour:

- 1. The tour is not compulsory but optional.
- 2. Students should produce No Objection Letter from their parent / guardian in the prescribed format.
- 3. They have to be accompanied by a male and a female faculty, a male and a female parent representative. A female faculty and a female parent are compulsory when girls are participating the tour.
- 4. The following details should be furnished two weeks before the journey –

- a. The itinerary Details of the place(s) of visit, stay and route (including the address and phone number)
- b. List of students participating in the tour
- c. Estimate of the tour programme
- d. Estimate of the per head contribution

The above mentioned details have to be prepared in consultation with the faculty accompanying the students for the tour and the Head of the Department and approved by the Head of the Institution.

5. Permission for a tour will be granted only when the above stated requirements are fulfilled and at least 75% of the students in the class are participating in the tour.

II. General rules:

- 1. The students joining the tour should maintain discipline and dignity of the College.
- 2. The ID Card has to be worn while on industrial visits.
- 3. They have to strictly adhere to the instructions of the accompanying faculty.
- 4. The students who are misbehaving during a tour will not be recommended for further tour programmes.
- 5. The Principal holds the authority of recommending / not recommending any student for a tour without assigning any reason.
- 6. Students who are involved in anti disciplinary actions such as suspension or warning are not allowed to join the study tour.

STUDENTS' COUNCIL

The various positions in College Students' Council are:

1. The President of the Student Council is the Principal (ex-officio)

- 2. Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Joint Secretary
- 3. The Secretaries of the various College Associations.
- 4. One representative of I DC, II DC and III DC classes stand elected by the students of the respective classes.
- 5. The Student Editor of the College Magazine.
- 6. Secretary of Fine Arts.
- 7. General Captain
- 8. The Staff Advisor nomiated by the President.

The Union Secretary shall act as the Secretary of the Executive Committee. All the office bearers of the Students' Council will be nominated by the Principal in consultation with the animators and Head of the Departments.

STUDY GROUPS

Study Groups / Leaders

- ◆ Study groups will be formed in all the classes with 5-8 members.
- One of the members will be the group leader.
- The group leader should not have any back paper.
- ◆ The number of boys and girls in a study group shall be equal.
- ◆ No group will consist of only boys or girls, unless it is permitted by the Principal.
- New groups will be formed each semester.
- Four study groups will be administered by an animator.

Animators

◆ The animators are to maintain an up-to-date record of all the students in the study group.

◆ They are required to meet the students regularly at least once a month, monitor their progress, guide them as required and furnish the report to the Principal.

Class Leader / Assistant Class Leader

- ◆ The term of class leader / assistant class leader shall be one year.
- ◆ They will be nominated by the Principal in consultation with the animators from among the group leaders.
- They shall not have any back paper.
- One boy and a girl shall hold the two positions.
- New nominations should take place each year.

IT POLICY


